

B. Confusing Terms

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Salafism

- Al salaf al salih "The pious forefathers", i.e. Muhammad and his earliest companions.
- Try to imitate in every detail; literal, narrow interpretation of the Qu'ran & Hadith
- Focus on purity of Islam
- Ibn Taymiyyah; Islamic scholar (1263-1328)

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Wahabism

- Muhammad Ibn Abd al-Wahab (1703-1792)
- Arab; Salafi scholar
- Reformer; promoted extremely rigid form of Islam
- Pact made with the Al-Saud family

B. Confusing Terms

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Takfiri

- ♣ In Islam, taking the life of another Muslim is the worst of sins.
- *Takfir*: Declaring other Muslims to be apostates or not true Muslims

Takfiri

- ♠ Apostates from Islam are under a death penalty, and non-Muslims are to be fought—so killing them is no longer a sin.
- A *Takfiri* is an extremist who uses this as a way to silence moderate Muslims, "purify" the faith, and get rid of opposition.

C. Confusing Behavior

- Not all extremists are violent themselves.
- Extremists do not all agree on methods, timing, authority, Islamic law, immediate goals, etc.
- Extremists are not unified (thankfully!).

➡ Islamic Revolution in Iran (*Result*: powerful Shi'a extremist government; new enemy of Israel; oil prices doubled in one year)

Soviet invasion of Afghanistan (*Result*: jihadi movement; Taliban; Al Qaeda)

Grand Mosque in Mecca seized by Sunni extremists (*Result*: more power given to fundamentalists; oil wealth used to spread Wahabi form of Islam)



A. The Extremist Ideology

- Allah is the universal lawgiver. He alone has the authority to establish the laws that should govern mankind.
- When men make laws, they are essentially usurping Allah's authority as lawgiver.

A. The Extremist Ideology

- ♣ It is oppression to require people to obey man-made laws. It's essentially slavery.
- Cultures, religions, and governments do not teach the truth about Allah and Muhammad.

A. The Extremist Ideology

When cultures, religions and governments reject the message of Islam, they are in a state of rebellion and aggression against Allah.

A. The Extremist Ideology

■ It is the duty of Muslims to wage

jihad to remove all obstacles in the

way of Islam so that Allah's law can be
established.

B. The Extremist Method of Interpreting the Qur'an

1. The Doctrine of Abrogation

Earlier verses (from the Meccan & early Medinan era) of the Qur'an were "provisional", based on the weak circumstances of the Islamic community.

Earlier Verses

"Say, 'O atheists, I don't serve what you serve, and you don't serve what I serve. . . You have your way and I have my way."

Qur'an 109:1-6

"Fight for the cause of Allah those who wage war against you, but do not commit aggression. Indeed, Allah does not love aggressors." Qur'an 2:190

B. The Extremist Method of Interpreting the Qur'an

1. The Doctrine of Abrogation

The "final rulings" of the Qur'an (from the late Medinan era) supersede or abrogate the earlier verses

"Final Rulings" of the Qur'an

Regarding polytheists/atheists:

"A call from Allah and Allah's messenger. . . announce a painful penalty for those who disbelieve...when the sacred months [of warning are past then kill the idolators wherever you find them and capture them and blockade them...But if they repent and practice prayer and give alms [accept Islam], let them go their way." Qur'an 9:3-5

"Final Rulings" from the Qur'an

Regarding People of the Book:

"Fight the ones among those to whom scripture has been given [Jews & Christians] who . . . do not profess the religion of truth [Islam], until they pay the jizya (tax) willingly, and feel themselves subdued."

Qur'an 9:29

B. The Extremist Method of Interpreting the Qur'an

2. Narrow, rigid and literal interpretation of the Qur'an; often accept "weaker" Hadith.


C. The Extremist Worldview

Dar al-Islam "The House of Islam"

Ruled by Sharia

Muslims Dhimmis Aggressor

Obligated to "fight"



Dar al-harb "The House of War"

Ruled by manmade laws; Unsubdued Non-Muslims

Why an "Islamic State"?

"Islamic Sharia is a complete scheme of life and an all-embracing social order. Therefore there is no separation between "state and church"... Thus, the Islamic State is an indispensable condition of Islamic life, in the true sense of the word "Islam".



Now what?
What should
Christians do?

1. Resist Prejudice.

- Islam is not a monolith; there are widely varied interpretations, practices, and attitudes.
- Most Muslims are normal people who just want to live their lives in peace.
- Tens of thousands of Muslims are also suffering at the hands of extremists.

2. Reject Fear.

"Do not fear what they fear. Do not be frightened. But in your hearts set apart Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to anyone who asks you to give a reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect, keeping a clear conscience...

3. Remember the bigger story.

5. Raise your voice—to advocate

- Ten years ago there were 1.5 million Christians in Iraq; now no more than 300,000.
- Syria's 2 million-person Christian community is decimated.
- Egypt's 8 million Coptic Christians have experienced more persecution in the past 3 years than in the previous 600 years combined.

5. Raise your voice—to advocate

"It's shocking to me that Americans are so silent in the face of our genocide. Please help us. Raise your voice for us. Our children are dying. In America you care for your pets so well, can you care for your Christian brothers and sisters who are suffering?" (An Iraqi nun)
